SCHOLARSHIPS

W*ith the generous support* of industry partners and families invested in the future of skilled workers, approximately \$1 million in SkillsUSA scholarships were made available to SkillsUSA members in the 2022-2023 academic year. In this banner scholarship year, 304 students accepted scholarships to attend postsecondary training or SkillsUSA conferences. This report highlights the annual scholarships, the donors and quotes from recipients who applied their awards to the 2022-2023 academic year.

This report does not include all prizes and scholarships awarded by SkillsUSA and SkillsUSA donors, such as those awarded to medalists at the National Skills & Leadership Conference (NLSC).

SKILLSUSA–AEROTEK MAKE YOUR MARK SCHOLARSHIP

In 2023, thanks to a generous donation from Aerotek, SkillsUSA members in select pathways planning to enroll or currently enrolled in a community college, technical college, certification program or apprenticeship were eligible to apply for the new SkillsUSA–Aerotek “Make Your Mark” Scholarship. In Spring 2023, 356 students applied and 132 students received an award of up to \$5,000 to continue their postsecondary training in their chosen field of study.
