\$1 Million in Scholarships Awarded

SkillsUSA Partners Support Student Education Goals

SkillsUSA and its industry partners award a number of scholarships to America's top career and technical students in conjunction with the SkillsUSA National Leadership & Skills Conference. These scholarships support higher education, travel to the national conference and leadership development for students who plan to further their education in community colleges, undergraduate programs or industry certifications. From Sept. 1, 2024 to Aug. 31, 2025, SkillsUSA and its partners offered 14 college/postsecondary scholarships with a total estimated dollar value of over \$1 million.

Aerotek #MakeYourMark Scholarship

Since 2023, Aerotek has awarded scholarship awards up to \$5,000 to eligible SkillsUSA members in select pathways to offset the costs of postsecondary tuition at a community college, technical college or certificate program. These scholarships can also be used to offset costs associated with an apprenticeship.

Bob Westphal Memorial Scholarship

The Bob Westphal Memorial Scholarship is offered in partnership with North American Oil & Gas Pipelines (Benjamin Media Inc.) and Continuum Capital. It provides four merit-based scholarships of \$2,500 in 2025 to high school or college/postsecondary students continuing their education to pursue a career in energy construction (oil and gas pipelines, gas distribution, solar and wind).

Clifford H. "Ted" Rees, Jr. Scholarship

The Clifford H. "Ted" Rees, Jr. Scholarship Foundation, an Air-Conditioning, Heating, and Refrigeration Institute (AHRI) Charitable Foundation, offers four one-time, merit-based \$2,500 scholarships to SkillsUSA members in 2025. The scholarship provides tuition support for students pursuing postsecondary education/training in HVACR.

Fine Homebuilding #KeepCraftAlive Scholarship for Construction Students

Fine Homebuilding awarded multiple \$2,500 #KeepCraftAlive Scholarships to SkillsUSA high school or college/postsecondary students continuing their education or certification program in construction-related fields such as architectural drafting, carpentry, cabinetmaking, electrical and residential wiring, HVACR masonry, woodworking or plumbing.

Harbor Freight Tools for Schools NLSC Travel Scholarship

The Harbor Freight Tools for Schools Travel Scholarship grants SkillsUSA members up to \$1,500 per student to assist in attending the 2025 National Leadership & Skills Conference (NLSC). Students must be SkillsUSA members who are registered to compete in the SkillsUSA Championships in specific contests.

Hyundai NLSC Travel Scholarship

The Hyundai Travel Scholarship opportunity granted SkillsUSA members up to \$1,500 per student to assist in attending the 2025 National Leadership & Skills Conference (NLSC). Students must be SkillsUSA members and registered to compete in the SkillsUSA Championships in Automotive Service Technology or Automotive Maintenance and Light Repair.

Larry Rash Memorial Scholarship

The Larry Rash Scholarship opportunity awarded one \$2,500 scholarship in 2025 to support active SkillsUSA members who plan to further their education in architectural drafting or a related field. One scholarship is granted to the best qualified applicant as demonstrated through an online application process. The second scholarship is awarded to the 2025 national high school gold medalist in architectural drafting.

Marsha Daves Memorial Scholarship

SkillsUSA offers one annual \$1,500 scholarship to a state officer for college/postsecondary education in memory of Marsha Daves, a former SkillsUSA state and national leader. The merit-based scholarship honors Marsha's legacy by recognizing how student leaders are empowered by the skills they have gained through SkillsUSA, and how the skills they develop help them become better team members, leaders, employees and community members.

NAPA SkillsUSA Transportation Repair Pathway Scholarship

NAPA awards a scholarship to active SkillsUSA members who plan to further their education in a transportation related pathway. Awards are paid directly to the student's college or postsecondary institution tuition or for documented direct educational costs (tools, PPE, on-campus or housing bill).

National Technical Honor Society Scholarships

The National Technical Honor Society (NTHS) annually awards four \$1,000 scholarships to SkillsUSA members who are also members of NTHS. Awards are paid directly to the student's college or postsecondary institution and applied to the student's tuition account.

Robert Flint Leadership Development Scholarships for Leverage

The Robert Flint Foundation provides four SkillsUSA state officers with awards of \$1,300 each to support travel to the Leverage leadership training at the 2025 National Leadership & Skills Conference. SkillsUSA state association directors must submit applications for scholarship candidates. Each state association, including both high school and college/postsecondary associations, may apply for each state officer on their team. The Robert Flint Foundation will also offer four \$800 awards to students to offset the cost of attending the Washington Leadership Training Institute (WLTI) offered each September in Washington, D.C. Only SkillsUSA state association directors must submit applications for scholarship candidates.

Sharon Melton Myers Memorial Scholarship

The Sharon Melton Myers Memorial Fund and the McMinn County Tennessee Vocational Center SkillsUSA Alumni Association award two SkillsUSA high school seniors in any pathway a one-time \$1,000 scholarship to support further education in a college or postsecondary program.

Warner Bros. Discovery NLSC Grant

Warner Bros. Discovery is partnering with SkillsUSA to offer NLSC travel grants to students in select states who are competing in the Arts, A/V Technology and Communication career cluster or in the Architecture and Construction career cluster.

WD-40 Scholarship

WD-40 offers ten \$1,500 college/postsecondary scholarships to SkillsUSA members who are pursuing education in CNC, HVAC, Electrical Construction Wiring, Welding, Automotive Service Technology or other Transportation, Distribution and Logistics fields.
