HOW PROJECTS WORK

In this course, projects guide you through a fun and flexible process that helps you build skills and express your creativity by:

- Exploring: Explore skills and participate in activities to spark your creativity.
- Planning: Use brainstorming and writing to organize your thoughts to plan your photoshoot. This helps you turn your ideas into a clear plan.
- Capturing: Bring your plan to life by using your DSLR camera to take photos. This is your chance to practice technical skills and show your unique lens.
- Creating: Use Adobe Lightroom and Photoshop to edit your photos and make them shine. Some projects even invite you to create a photo series, like telling a story with multiple pictures!
- Reflecting: Helps you grow and prepares you for even more exciting projects ahead.

HOW CANVAS HELPS YOU ALONG THE WAY

Canvas is your go-to spot to submit work, find directions, and stay organized. Projects will be organized as modules with the following as part of each module:

- Project Overview: Is your project roadmap and has all the important details and links for each project.
- Explore Activity: Explore concepts, gain additional skills, and explore background info
 to inspire your creativity.
- Creative Launchpad: This is where you brainstorm and plan your photoshoot, think
 of it as your creative workspace.
- Unfiltered Uploads: This shows off your camera and technical skills before editing.
- Polished Photos: Bring your ideas to life using Adobe Lightroom and/or Photoshop then upload your edited photos or photo series.
- Reflection Activity: An activity to think about your work, explain your choices, and plan how to use your new skills in future projects.

GRADING BREAKDOWN

In this course, grades reflect your growth as a photographer, not just what you finish, but how you think, plan, and work through creative photo projects using standards-based rubrics that are available on Canvas. Parents and students can review grades in ParentVUE/StudentVUE by clicking the "Grades" link on the bottom of the Canvas Home Page. Grades are cumulative for each semester with progress reports reflecting current performance through grades updated every two weeks. In addition to notes in StudentVUE/ParentVUE, students will receive feedback through Canvas, class activities like Gallery Walks, and self-reflection.

GRADEBOOK NOTES

The following notes are added to the gradebook assignments to support student accountability and ensure clear communication:

- ICNS (In Class Assignment, Not Submitted): The assignment was worked on during class but was not submitted when we completed the submission process as a class. A 15% late penalty applies.
- ICNSX (In Class Assignment Not Submitted, Closed): The final deadline for submission has passed. The work is no longer being accepted, and students will receive 45% of the points available for the assignment.
- AB (Excused Absence Extension) The student has and excused absences near the due date and has been granted additional time to submit without penalty.
- ABL (Excused Absence Extension, Late): Work was submitted late following an excused absence extension. A 10% penalty applies.
- ABX (Excused Absence Extension, Closed): The final deadline for submission has
 passed. The work is no longer being accepted, and students will receive 45% of the
 points available for the assignment.
- ET (Extended Time): The student has additional time based on a timely conversation with the teacher and/or documented IEP/504 accommodations with no penalty.
- ETL (Extended Time, Late): The assignment was submitted late after an extension was granted. A 10% penalty applies.
- ETX (Extended Time, Closed): The final deadline for submission has passed. The work is no longer being accepted, and students will receive 45% of the points available for the assignment.
- PL (Plagiarism): Indicates a violation of the academic integrity policy. A first offense results in a 75% penalty and the opportunity to redo the assignment. A second offense leads to a referral.
