SkillsUSA Recruitment

Learning Objectives: Identify key aspects of SkillsUSA and encourage student membership.

Overview: Students will watch a short video titled, "We are SkillsUSA" Then they will complete a scavenger hunt around the room to find important words and symbols that are part of SkillsUSA. Students will use a handout with questions to write down answers about each item as they complete the scavenger hunt. Students end with a "Parking Lot" exercise and write down questions they still have about SkillsUSA for the instructor to answer.





Time Required: 40 minutes

Suggested participants: All middle school students

Materials Needed: Lesson PowerPoint Slide deck (optional), A/V equipment, SkillsUSA logo, "We are SkillsUSA" video, SkillsUSA Scavenger Hunt items printed out and hidden around an area, SkillsUSA Scavenger Hunt handout (one per student), Sticky notes (one per student), Writing utensil for each student, Parking lot poster or drawing on white board

Facilitation Instructions:

Part 1: Gauge students' level of knowledge (4 minutes)

Do: Display an image of the SkillsUSA logo.

Say: "Give a thumbs up if you have seen this logo before." (allow for response time)

Say: "What do you know about this logo?" (allow for 2-3 responses)

Say: "What are your initial thoughts about this logo?" (allow for 2-3 responses)

Say: "Where have you seen this logo before?" (allow for 2-3 responses)

Say: "This is the SkillsUSA logo. SkillsUSA is a ional organization for students like you! It includes middle school, high school, and college/postsecondary learners. You have the unique opportunity to join SkillsUSA if you choose, so today we will answer the question: What is SkillsUSA?"

Part 2: Introduce SkillsUSA (3 minutes)

Do: Show the short video titled "<u>We are SkillsUSA</u>."

Say: "What is something that stuck out to you?" (allow a few students to share)

Say: "Those are all important aspects of SkillsUSA, but there's even more to discover."

Part 3: Learn about SkillsUSA (30 minutes)

Say: "Who has completed a scavenger hunt before?" (have one or two students share about their experience)

Say: "Today we have our own SkillsUSA Scavenger Hunt! You will receive a handout with a list of items related to SkillsUSA. Each item has some information that will help you answer the questions on the handout. It is your mission to find every item and answer the questions before the timer runs out in 15 minutes. You may work with a partner."

Activity: "Scavenger Hunt"

- 1. Pass out the Scavenger Hunt papers and allow students to search the room.
- Give boundaries if necessary, such as "You may not open any cabinet and drawer. All items are found in the classroom and shop."
- 3. Monitor students as they work.
- 4. After 15 minutes, bring students back together.
- 5. Go over each question and answers; share more information about each question as you wish.

Part 4: Closing (3 minutes)

Do: Give each student a sticky note.

Say: "We've covered a lot of information, and this is only the tip of the iceberg for all that SkillsUSA has to offer! Take one minute and write down at least one question you still have about SkillsUSA on the sticky note. Then place it in the Parking Lot I've placed on the wall. I will answer your questions in future classes."

► Activity "Parking lot"

- 1. Students each write one question.
- 2. Students place the question on the parking lot poster or drawing.
- 3. Answer their questions during the next few class periods.

Tips For Success

- Keep the energy high.
- ✓ If students are quiet and unwilling to share, use a "think-pair-share" to engage students before sharing with the full group.
- Encourage students to try SkillsUSA; they have nothing to lose and everything to gain.

Conclusion

Every student will benefit from participation in SkillsUSA. As teachers, we must promote and make all students aware of the opportunities. Then address obstacles and barriers to membership. Finally, help each student find their place in the organization.

SkillsUSA is America's proud champion of the skilled trades. Our mission is to empower students to become skilled professionals, career-ready leaders and responsible community members.






SkillsUSA Emblem

- 1. The **shield** represents patriotism.
- 2. The *gear* represents the industrial society.
- 3. The *torch* represents knowledge.
- 4. The *orbital circles* represent technology.
- 5. The *bands* represent the individual.

Red and white represent the individual states and chapters.





SkillsUSA Colors #3

Blue represents the common union of the states and of the chapters.

Gold represents the individual, the most important element of the organization
